Math Practice
*Play board games and/or card games (such as dominos or war) to practice math skills *Recognizing and count by number patterns (skip counting by l's, 2's, \& 5's)
*Talk about the calendar and

You can use the High Frequency words or spelling words with this activity.
-Call them out in the car
-Write them using bubble letters
-Use Scrabble tiles \& add the points

Writing
*Take turns writing back and forth *Encourage your child to write about his/her favorite things
*Write a list of things they are hoping to receive from Santa
*Remind them to use complete sentences and spell sight words correctly.
*Make sure vour child can read their own

Reading for 10+ Minutes
Students must read over 10 minutes to earn a star. If they read longer they can fill in the blank for the total minutes read.
*Explore multiple books from the same author.
*Notice interesting, new vocabulary words, and use them in conversation.
*Explore nonfiction books and their features.

Questions to ask after reading
-What is the main idea and supporting details?
-What was the problem?
-What was the solution?
-Tell me the story in order, starting at the beginning.
